

JOHN REX PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ENROLLMENT AND ADMISSION POLICIES

JANUARY 7, 2019

Effective for students enrolling for the 2019-20 school year and thereafter, John Rex proposes the following changes to its enrollment and admission policies:

1. In accordance with Oklahoma Charter School Law, the JRCS Board of Directors will annually determine the capacity of the school. The Board authorizes the Head of School, or his/her designee, to annually determine the number of classes offered at each grade level and class size capacity limits. Once the school capacity is reached, no additional students shall be admitted with the following exception: the Head of School, or designee, may continue to admit Tier 1 residents so long as the school is able to facilitate the academic success of its students and achieve the objectives specified in the charter contract;
2. If the residence of a student changes during the school year resulting in a change in the student's original admission tier and the admission tier applying to the student's new residence is *less advantageous* than at the time of original admission, the student shall be required to re-apply for admission to the school and enter the lottery for the next school year based on their current tier;
3. Students enrolled in the school prior to the 2019-20 school year shall be grandfathered under the current applicable enrollment/admission policies and remain subject to said policies. However, all students, regardless of admission year or tier, must annually re-verify residency by submitting required documentation and completing all required re-enrollment forms. All students must be in good standing at the time of re-verification.
4. The school shall no longer accept applications from Tier 4 students. Further, students who enroll in the school in the 2019-20 school year or thereafter, whose admission to the school is based on residency in the Oklahoma City Public School District (Tier 1 or 2) who move out of said district shall not be admitted to the school for the term following said residence change.
5. For families of students who enroll in the school in the 2019-20 school year or thereafter, priority sibling enrollment shall be limited only to siblings of current students who are entering the school at the pre-kindergarten level.
