How would it be different if the setting was on a beach?</p>	<p>Read with family. Talk about the book. If you were the author, how would you continue the story? Draw & write your responses.</p>
<p>Practice sight words: With sidewalk chalk, In a tray of salt/sand, Dry erase boards, With playdough, etc.</p>	<p>Make homemade cloud dough! Mix 2 cups of cornstarch or flour and one cup of lotion. Talk about measurements as you do it and then enjoy playing.</p>	<p>Count to 100! By 1s, 10s, and 5s</p>	<p>Write a card to a family member or friend. Mail it or give it to your family member.</p>
<p>Find some coins, practice sorting into groups and name the coins.</p>	<p>Practice counting pennies & dimes. Start with 1 dime and different amounts of pennies. If this is easy for your child, add another dime.</p>	<p>Go on a backyard nature walk. Find 5 items and write a sentence about each one.</p>	<p>Retell a familiar story or make up a story of your own story!</p>

<p>Sing a song: Days of the Week, Months of the Year, Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star Or find a new one to sing!</p>	<p>Rhyme Time- Pick a word to start with and rhyme back and forth.</p> <p>Words to start with: Can, Pet, Tin, Sod, Sun</p>	<p>Parents- say each letter sound aloud and have your child blend them to say the word: s-u-n, w-i-n, t-a-p</p>	<p>Spend time making up your own story. Act it out for family, record it to share with a friend, or just practice it for yourself!</p>
